Keynote Speaker



Dr. Deborah J. Leong is professor emerita of Psychology and she taught developmental and educational psychology for 32 years at Metropolitan State College of Denver. She is Director of the Tools of the Mind Project. Dr. Leong developed the *Tools of the Mind* program with Dr. Elena Bodrova (Senior Researcher at McREL). Dr. Leong is also a senior research fellow at the National Institute for Early Education Research (NIEER) at Rutgers University.

Dr. Leong and her colleague Dr. Elena Bodrova have written numerous books, articles, and educational videos on the Vygotskian Approach to Psychology and the development of play. She has also written several books on early childhood assessment with Drs. Oralie McAfee and Elena Bodrova. Dr. Leong has her Ph.D. from Stanford University and her M.Ed. from Harvard University.
